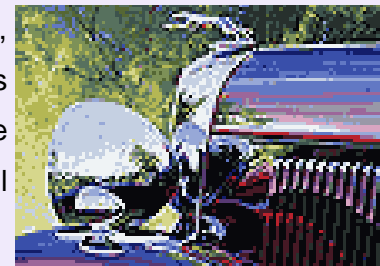
TOM HALE

Tom Hale writes: "I was drawing automobiles at seven years old and have simply never stopped. I study intently the surfaces of a particular automobile trying to understand the reflective patterns and "why" ... light reacts the way it does on an automobile. [I can] ... use that surface as my canvas and attempt to create a work of art depicting what I see and imagine. I find automobiles, especially the classics and that wonderful era of the 50's to be intriguing subjects for a work of art."

Farmington Hills based artist Tom Hale exhibits and sells his work nationally. Through his unique, dramatic style of painting, he utilizes striking colors to create beautifully executed vehicle paintings. Be sure to look for a flower usually somewhere in each piece.

Mr. Hale holds the Gold Medal of Honor, 113th Annual American Watercolor Society for his painting "CHROME", he is a Signature member and Dolfin Fellow of American Watercolor Society, a Signature member of the National Watercolor Society and a member of Automotive Fine Art Society.
