How to show your Art

Intro - Art Clubs - Membership Fees, etc. everything has a fee.

Membership \$ to a particular art club/group usually allows you one entry into their annual membership show at no extra \$.

Along with that membership you may get a reduced fee to 'enter' into other shows During the membership year.

This doesn't guarantee you will be accepted

Into the show.___

Why fees? Rent etc.

If it's a juried show they have to pay the juror. If there are prizes part of the fees go to that. Be tough - there will be rejections

Art fairs \$\$\$\$\$

Commissions – if you sell a painting at one of these clubs/galleries, they will take a % out of your sales.

It can range from 10-50%

Three Cities no longer takes commissions \$.

Sales: cash or venmo. I avoid checks & c/c

Solo exhibit applications :

If you have a 'collection' of paintings - apply for a solo show, or split with another artist.

Purpose:

What is the plan?

Make a living/pay bills - only a rare few artists accomplish this.
